Man's Search for Meaning by Viktor E. Frankl

Internationally renowned psychiatrist Viktor E. Frankl endured years of unspeakable horror in Nazi death camps. During and partly because of his suffering, Dr. Frankl developed a revolutionary approach to psychotherapy known as logotherapy. At the core of his theory is the belief that man's primary motivational force is his search for meaning. Gordon W. Allport says that *Man's Search For Meaning* is "a compelling introduction to the most significant psychological movement of our day."
