Hebrews 4:12-16

The word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing until it divides soul from spirit, joints from marrow; it is able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart. And before him no creature is hidden, but all are naked and laid bare to the eyes of the one to whom we must render an account.

Since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

THE HOLY GOSPEL + Mark 10:17-31

Priest The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

As Jesus was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, “Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?” Jesus said to him, “Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: ‘You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honor your father and mother.’” He said to him, “Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth.” Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, “You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.” When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, “How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!” And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, “Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.” They were greatly astounded and said to one another, “Then who can be saved?” Jesus looked at them and said, “For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.”

Peter began to say to him, “Look, we have left everything and followed you.” Jesus said, “Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.”

A STEWARDSHIP EPISTLE FROM JULIA SPEYER

I was honored and humbled when I was asked, by the stewardship committee, to briefly speak about why I give to All Saints.









I have never lived in Brookline, but All Saints is my church, my home. I have been a member of All Saints since 1985. I was married here. My children grew up here. When I see our parish children playing in the yard, climbing the trees—it is pretty clear that they know that this church is their home too. That makes me very happy.

The theme of this year's stewardship season is community, which all saints certainly is. All Saints is much more than this beautiful building. There is a South African saying, "I am because we are," and I think that applies to All Saints. We are All Saints. Each of us in some way shapes this parish. I think of all the different programs that All Saints offers, and the richness of worship here, and I know that there are skillful, caring people who are generously sharing their time, talent, and treasure and, without whom, those programs wouldn't exist. I am really awed by it all and so grateful to those that make it happen.





When the pandemic shut down everything in March of 2020, and worship services went on-line (Again, thanks to the generous work of many very talented folks!), I wasn't sure that we would continue to feel like a community—if we couldn't gather together. But even then, participating in the service at home in front of a computer, I knew I was part of something bigger. It was enormously uplifting to know that we, in fact, were not worshipping alone, but together, even though we were physically separate. The joy of now being able to gather physically together is something we all share. For me, being able to sing in the choir again, even with a mask, is like when spring comes after a very long winter.

Why do I give to All Saints? Because I love this parish. I am a part of this church and the church, is a part of me. All Saints is my home. I pledge to support my home and our community.
