## AFFIRMATION OF FAITH: Nicene Creed

*BCP 358*

**We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.**

**We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.**

**We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.**



## WE SHARE THE GIFTS OF GOD

*Presider* The Gifts of God for the people of God.

**RECEIVING COMMUNION**— Please gather clockwise all around the altar. You may stand or kneel to receive. Individuals at higher risk for infection are encouraged to receive the bread only; Christ is fully present in all elements of the Sacrament. Gluten-free bread is available, ask the person serving the bread.

**RECEIVING THE COMMON CUP**—after eating the bread, please help guide the SILVER chalice to your lips.

**RECEIVING USING INTINCTION**—hold the wafer in your hand and wait for a chalice bearer holding a GREEN ceramic intinction cup to approach, gently dip the wafer into the cup and then eat it.

If you desire a blessing instead of either bread or wine, simply cross your arms across your chest. If you need Communion brought to you in the pew, please notify the ushers.

Prayers for healing are offered on the second Sunday of July and August at the Langdon Chapel during Communion.

*Healing ministers keep a strict rule of confidentiality. Share only what you are comfortable with. The minister may lay hands on your head, shoulders, or neck and offer a prayer for God's presence and healing. The minister may also mark the sign of the cross on your forehead.*

## VOLUNTARY

### Deacons in the Liturgy

It is rare to have a deacon serving at All Saints, but we are blessed to have one now—at least for a few months. A deacon's role in the liturgy is a direct reflection of their ministry in the world as proclaimers of the Gospel and as servants to all, especially to those in need. Deacons traditionally perform the following functions in the liturgy: carry the Gospel book, proclaim the Gospel, receive the gifts at the altar, prepare the altar for Communion, assist in the distribution of Communion, and give the dismissal. We want to afford Silas every opportunity to live fully into their diaconal ministry, and so they will be fulfilling these diaconal roles in the Sunday liturgy until (God willing and the people consenting) they are ordained a priest sometime this winter.
